Protect Your Farm: Prevent Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD)

FOR INFORMATION

What is FMD?

Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) is a highly contagious viral disease that affects all cloven-hoofed animals, including cattle. In Canada, FMD is a reportable disease under the Health of Animals Act. All suspected cases must be reported immediately to the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA).

Signs of FMD in Cattle:

- Fever
- Blister-like sores on the tongue, lips, mouth, teats, and between hooves
- Symptoms include animals off feed, lip smacking, grinding teeth, drooling, and lameness

Review Your Biosecurity

A solid biosecurity plan can prevent disease outbreaks. Follow these steps:

- Ensure all visitors and workers follow strict biosecurity practices.
- Contaminated clothing, equipment, or food could introduce FMD onto your farm.

For Travellers: Stay Informed, Stay Safe

Prevention Starts with You:

- Avoid farm visits in countries affected by FMD.
- Clean and disinfect clothing and belongings after international travel.
- Delay contact with livestock for 5 days after travelling to an FMD-positive country or **14 days** if returning from a country without an official FMD-negative status.
- Do not bring meat or animal products into Canada.
- Declare all foods, plants, and animals to a Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) officer when entering Canada.

Farm Precautions: Protect Your Herd

Canadian producers must take extra precautions:

- Discourage farm tours for international visitors.
- Review and reinforce biosecurity protocols for farm workers, suppliers, and visitors.
- Discuss travel plans with your farm employees, determine the appropriate downtime to be observed on your return, and plan accordingly!
- Access additional resources through CCA Emergency Preparedness and Beef Cattle Biosecurity Standard.

Travel Tips: Prevent FMD Transmission

Before you travel:

- Check for disease outbreaks at agricultural sites you plan to visit.
- Avoid direct contact with animals, their waste, and feed.
- Clean and disinfect all items brought onto farms and wash hands thoroughly.
- Separate dirty clothes in a plastic bag and change into clean clothes after visits.

After Your Trip: Stay Safe

- **Launder or dry clean** clothes, and disinfect footwear worn during farm visits.
- Follow required downtime before returning to work on your farm. A good rule of thumb is a **5-day** wait after your last farm visit.
